The Poulsbo Sportsman Club in its effort to serve the local community, is proud to sponsor Washington State's Hunter Education Instruction Program. Persons born after January 01, 1972 are required to have completed and passed a certified Hunter Education Course in order to purchase a Washington State Hunting License. Every year since its inception, the Washington State Hunter Education Program has contributed to a reduction in hunting and firearm incidents through education and "hands on" instruction in the safe handling of firearms.

Hunter Education courses at the Poulsbo Sportsman Club are held evenings, Monday through Friday from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM at the Clubhouse at 16990 Clear Creek Road.

For 2011, classes are the weeks of:

June 06 – 10

July 11 – 15

Aug 08 -12

There is no charge for the class but reservations (25 students max. per class) are required.

To register a student, go to the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife web site: www.wdfw.wa.gov/http://www.wdfw.wa.gov/hunting/huntered/classes/basic.php then click on the link for courses being offered via online registration and search for classes at the Poulsbo Sportsman Club. There is no minimum age limit and be sure to let us know if there are special needs for the student.

All students must attend all class time / field instruction and pass a written exam, a field test and participate in a "live fire" on the range in order to earn a certificate which allows them to purchase a hunting license. Certificates are available upon passing the course requirements for those students who register through the WDFW Website.

DO NOT BRING ANY FIREARMS (INCLUDING CONCEALED CARRY PERSONS) OR LIVE AMMUNITION TO THE CLASS! All necessary materials including firearms, ammo, snacks, drinks and targets are provided by the Club and its participating groups.
