

WASHINGTON STATE HUNTER EDUCATION

The Poulsbo Sportsman Club in it's effort to serve the community is proud to sponsor Washington State's Hunter Education Instruction program. Persons born after January 01, 1972 are required to have completed and passed a certified Hunter Education Course in order to purchase a Hunting License. Every year since it's inception, the Washington State Hunter Education Program has helped reduce hunting and firearm accidents through education and hands on instruction in the safe handling of firearms.

Classes are held at the Clubhouse beginning at 6:00 pm Monday through Friday ending at 9:00 pm each evening. For 2008, classes are the weeks of:

- * June 02 thru June 06
- * July 14 thru July 18
- * August 11 thru August 15

There is no charge for the class and reservations are taken via email only after May 01, 2008. To register a student, (no age limit but students under 12 are required to have a parent or guardian remain with the student) send an email to: Doug Kitchens at doug@reidrealestate.com or Chuck Lumadue at chucklumadue@aol.com and include age and contact telephone number. If the student has special needs please be sure to include that information in the email as well.

All students must attend all class/field instruction and pass a written test, a field test and participate in the live fire on the Trap Range in order to earn a certificate which allows them to purchase a Hunting License. Certificates are mailed after the test results are sent to Department of Fish and Wildlife in Olympia and can take some time to get back to the student however accommodation for immediate purchase can be made for special circumstances. We hold each class to approximately 20 students so be sure to register early for the class that best suits your summer schedule.

DO NOT BRING ANY FIREARMS OR LIVE AMMUNITION to the class all necessary materials including snacks, drinks, ammunition, clay targets and range time are provided by the Poulsbo Sportsman Club's Cowboy Action and Trap groups. We want to thank both of these groups and their members for their support.
